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2. TERMINOLOGY



3. SAFETY SYSTEM

Before launching your kite always check if your primary and secondary safety system functions properly. The Compass Control Bar <u>Primary Release System</u> is the Quick Release of the Depower Loop. After activitating this Quick Release, the kite is only attached to your Harness by the Safety Leash. The Compass Control Bar <u>Secondary Safety System</u> is the Quick Release on the Safety Leash (Safety Leash not included with the bar). Activitating this Release means that you're completely seperated from you kite.



3.1 CONNECTING YOUR SAFETY SYSTEMS

Step 1 - Connect Safety Leash to the Harness

Connect your Safety leash by pushing the Dyneema loop of the Safety Leash through a metal ring on your harnass, Pull the red Quick Release of your Safety Leash up. Push the metal pin through the Dyneema loop and fold the pin back in the QR socket. Make sure it's fastened to your harness.

Step 2 - Attach the Safety Leash to the Kite

Hook the black metal buckle of the Safety Leash to the Safety Line Connector.

Step 3 - Reconnect your Quick Release Loop

Push the metal part at the end of the Quick Release Loop in the Quick Release Socket until you hear 'click'.

Step 4 - Attach the Quick Release Loop to the Harness

Attach the Quick Release Loop to your Harnass Hook by hooking in your Quick Release Loop. You are now connected to your Control Bar and kite.

Step 5 - Secure the connection by the Lock-in pin

The Lock-in pin prevents the loop from slipping of the Harnass hook. Twist the Lock-in pin until it point towards the harnass below the loop. Bend the Lock-in pin back and push it between the QR loop and the Harnass Hook. Make sure the Loop can not fall out of the Harnass when you lose tension.

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3.2 ACTIVATING YOUR PRIMARY SAFETY SYSTEM

Step 1 - Push away the Primary Quick Release

Push the red Quick Release away from your body. By doing this, the Loop will open and will be detached from your Harnass Hook. Your Control Bar will move away from you and the Safety System will be activitated. You are now only attached to your kite through your Safety Leash (Secondary Safety System).





3.3 ACTIVATING YOUR SECONDARY SAFETY SYSTEM

Step 1 - Push away the Quick Release of your Safety Leash

Push the red Quick Release of the Safety Leash away from your body. By doing this, the Loop will open and will be detached from your Harnass. You are now fully detached from your kite. This means that your kite does not have any Safety System left (!).





4. POWER ADJUSTING

POWER / DEPOWER

Depower

By moving your bar towards the kite, the steering lines get relatively longer/power lines get shorter and you depower your kite.



Power

By moving your bar towards your body, the steering lines get relatively shorter and you power your kite.



POWER ADJUSTER

Depower

You can depower your kite by making the trimline shorter. By pulling on the adjuster grab handle, towards you and securing it back into the clamcleat, your power lines get shorter and you depower the kite.

You can power your kite by loosening the trimline and making it longer. Take the adjuster grab handle, disengage the trimline from the clamcleat, move it away from you and secure it back into the clamcleat to power the kite







5. MAINTENANCE

MAINTENANCE

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Take proper care of your equipement! This will help your bar to last a lot longer

• Make sure you regularly check your bar for wear and tear. Make sure to check your depower loop, depower loop tube, depower/adjuster line, adjuster, safety line, endcaps, flying lines and sleeves on the flying lines. Replace parts when needed. There should be a large amount of replacement parts available at your local dealer.

• Before launching, always check that your quick releases are in working order.

• When reaching the water, before starting your kiteboarding session, splash some water on your bar to rinse off sand that is stuck to it. Also when using your bar on land, after launching wipe as much sand off your bar as possible. Especially remove sand from the depower loop, depower/adjuster line, center hole in your bar, stopper and adjuster. Also get rid of any sand on the safety line on the section next to the depower line.

• After every session, rinse your bar with tap water to remove the salt from the bar. Make sure your depower loop, depower/adjuster line, stopper and adjuster are free of sand.

• When using the PLKB Compass bar in the snow. Make sure the Quick Release systems are always clear of snow or ice at all time. A frozen Quick Release could result in malfunction and dangerous situations.

6. REPLACEMENT PARTS

6.1 REPLACING LOOP

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Move the Quick Release up revealing the Hex Screw of the Loop
- 2. Remove the Hex Screw until you can remove the Loop
- 3. Remove the loop and replace it
- 4. When putting back the loop, make sure that the cylinder of the new Loop lines up with the screw socket
- 5. Tighten the Hex Screw all the way until both sides are clear and the Quick Release closes smoothly







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6.2 REPLACING LOCK-IN PIN

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Remove the Loop (6.1) from its socket
- 2. Replace the Lock-in Pin
- 3. Attach the Loop back in its socket



6.3 REPLACING THE SAFETY LINE

To replace the Safety Line you need to remove the connector set below on the Quick Release and remove it from the Power Line. Don't forget to pull the Safety Line through the Clamcleat ring.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Remove the connector set below the Quick Release
- 2. Pull the Safety Line through the Quick Release and Clamcleat ring
- 3. Remove the Safety Line from the Power Line
- 4. Reverse previous steps











6.4 REPLACING ADJUSTER LINE



To remove the adjuster line, you need to remove the Adjuster Handle and remove the Adjuster Line from the Depower Line.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Unscrew the Hex Screw
- 2. Undo knot of the Grab Handle
- 3. Pull the Adjuster Line through the Line Splitter
- 4. Push the Adjuster Line towards the Clamcleat to get access to the connection with the Depower Line.
- the connection with the Depowe
- 5. detach the Adjuster line

6. Remove the old Adjuster Line and replace it with the new Adjuster Line.

7. Reverse steps 1-4

When your Adjuster line is lose, you can also replace the Depower Line if neccessary.









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BE AWARE: WHEN REMOVING THE HEX SCREW FROM THE SWIVEL HEAD, THE CERAMIC BALLS FROM THE BALL BEARING WILL BE LOSENED AND WILL FALL OUT!

To replace the Depower Line, you need to remove the Safety Line and Adjuster line first. To replace the Depower line,

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Remove the Safety Line from the Connector Set below the Quick Release
- 2. Unscrew the Hex Screws from the Swivel head
- 3. Pull the Swivel head top part from the bottom part (THIS WILL FREE THE CERAMIC BALLS)
- 4. Now you can losen the Depower Line from the Swivel head
- 5. Unscrew the Hex Screw in the Stopperball below the Clamcleat
- 6. Remove the Depower line from the Adjuster Line
- (The Adjuster Line needs to be losened from its Adjuster Handle).

NEW DEPOWER LINE

- 7. Add the Stopperball to the new Depower Line at the side of the long loop
- 8. Thread the long loop of the Depower Line through the Clamcleat
- 9. Attach the Adjuster Line
- 10. Push the Depower Line through the bar
- 11. Push the Depower Line through the Swivel head and fold it over its inside
- 12. Screw the Hex Screws back to Close and Complete the Quick Release
- (Don't forget to put al Ceramic balls back)
- 13. Push the Safety Line back through the Quick Release
- 14. Re-attach the Connector set of the Safety Line

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6.6 ADDING THE BRAKE LINE

The Brake Line or self-landing handle can be used to land your kite backwards on the ground and keep it on the ground using a groundstake. The size of the Brake Line depends on the size of the bar. Make sure you apply the correct Brake Line.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Unwind your lines
- 2. Push the loop of the Brake Line through the spliced loops on your leader lines.
- 3. Push each steering line through the loop of the Brake Line



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6.7 ADDING 5TH LINE SET

To have a working 5-line system on your PLKB Compass Control Bar, you need to add a 5th line and move the safety line from the powerline to the new 5th line. See next page for instructions.

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ADDING THE 5TH LINE

The 5th Line goes through the Line Splitter and should be attached to the Safety Line.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Detach the Safety Line from the Safety Line Connector.
- 2. Remove the Safety Line from the Power Line
- 3. Add the Rubber Tube above the Line Splitter on the Power Line
- 4. Add the Metal Rectangual Ring on the Power Line
- 5. Push the end of the 5th line through the Line Splitter
- 6. Push the loop of the Safety Line through that of the new 5th line
- 7. And pull the hole safety leash through it's own loop to attach it
- 8. Re-attach the safety line with the Safety Line Connector set



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ADDING THE LINE STOPPERBALL

The Line Stopperball is used to stop the bar from sliding all the way up to the kite after activating the Stop 'n Go safety system. Place the stopperball 3 meter away from the bar. This way the Stop 'n Go safety system will be activitated fully and your bar will stop after 3 meter.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Put both sides of the Stopperball on top of eachother with the line in between.
- 2. Leave 3 meter between the bar and the Stopperball.
- 3. Place the Bolt on one side and the nut on the other.
- 4. Fasten the Bolt with a Screwdriver.



7. WARRANTY
